of our Cooperative.

What is even more surprising, what is in fact astonishing, is that, given all this information about Mr. Harmon's personal spending habits, his expense-approval practices, the depth of his understanding of his duty to the member/owners, and the extent of his consideration of the member/owners' interests, many of you apparently stand ready to accept, without public protest, President R.B. Felps's appointment of Mr. Harmon to the new Expense Audit Committee of the Board.

I understand that the Board president has appointment privileges of some type, and that in the end you may not be able to block this appointment.

But I know, too, that many of you have personally profited from the manner in which Mr. Harmon performed his duty as treasurer of the Cooperative and as the person "responsible" for approving your expense vouchers and writing your checks. I know that many of you have exhibited the same spending habits and the same lack of regard for the Cooperative's member/owners and their interests.

Mr. Harmon's being re-elected to the offices of secretary and treasurer is a sad commentary, for it shows that many members of the Board still fail to recognize the damage the Board has inflicted on the Cooperative.

His now being named to serve on the Board's Expense Audit Committee simply underscores that lack of understanding. The appointment conveys an unmistakable message that,

waive payment in lieu of taxes (PILOT) for whatever time period was acceptable. Board president Loeffler confirmed that JISD had granted a waiver. The Board then decided to tie its waiver approval to that of the school district, stating that as long as the school would waive the payments, the hospital Board would too.

The Board then reviewed items to be considered for the 2008-2009 budget.

Payments to Preferred Management are tied to the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The CPI is currently at a 5% increase and should not change greatly for the remainder of the year.

There is also a cost to the Kimble Appraisal District for managing the tax collection

for the Hospital District. This will run approximately \$40,000.

The Hospital Board must also pay its portion of the fees for the election coming in May of 2009.

Finally, there is the cost of Director's Liability Insurance to be considered. Although Preferred Management now carries insurance for the Board, incidents that may arise from actions prior to their contract must still be covered. This will cost approximately \$14,000 for three years of coverage.

Once again, the Board spent time discussing the options for filling the open board position. Tasks were assigned to individual members with hopes that the issue could be resolved in time to swear in a new member at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

Mike Easley of Preferred

Management then presented the Board with a status report.

The estimate of assets and liabilities through May of this year has been completed. The cash value of the hospital assets is \$978,565.12. This number is subject to audit, but should be close to the value to be included in the contract with Preferred.

The profit and loss statement from June, Preferred's first month, was also available. It showed a net profit of \$36,465.75, some of which will be used to purchase new diagnostic equipment.

Easley also mentioned that Preferred was reviewing the home health services provided by the Hospital. He stated that any decisions made would be based on the requirements of

the population served.

A discussion centered around exploring options for upgrading or replacing the hospital facility. Decisions on this subject need to be made in the near future.

Before adjourning, board President Loeffler reviewed agenda items for the next meeting: the first item mentioned was the budget and upcoming tax rates; next was the disposition of money currently in grant accounts; filling the vacant board position was mentioned; and finally, further discussion and possible action on upgrading hospital facilities.

The next meeting was confirmed to be Monday, August 25, at 6 pm, in the Hospital conference room.

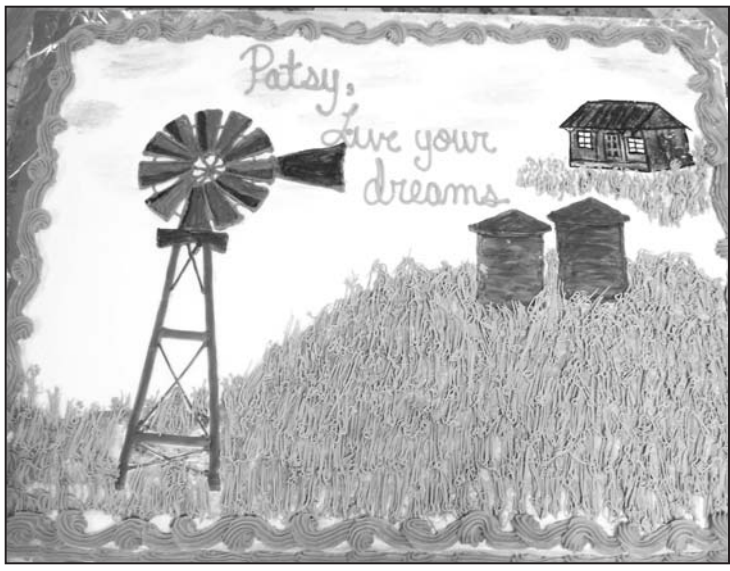
